In 2009, Skip was instrumental in establishing the first Easter Seals golf outing in central Wisconsin, an event which helped support the FARM program. In 2011, Skip passed away. To honor his legacy the event was named the Skip Ellenbecker Memorial Golf Outing and continues to benefit the FARM program in which he so fervently believed. In 2016, the outing raised over \$15,000.
