After learning more about the history of camp, attendees enjoyed a tractor ride tour of the camps, which extend over 400 acres just outside downtown Wisconsin Dells.

"It continues to amaze us when groups and organizations come together out of the goodness of their hearts to offer their time, talents, and financial support for another. For those who want to relax and watch others enjoying the new swings, Board member Jeanne Sterken donated a bench to be installed next to the sidewalk.
